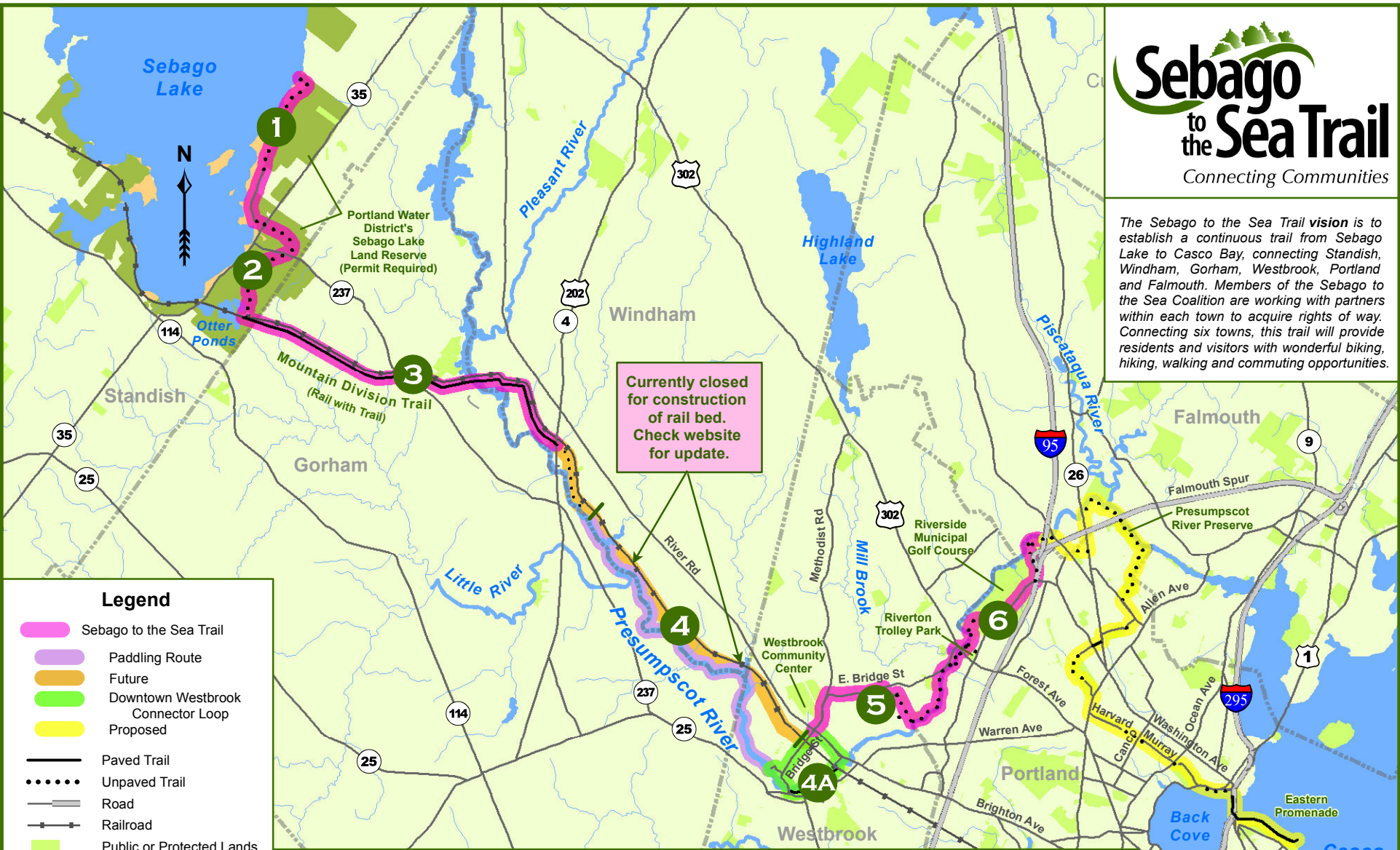


Sebago to the Sea Trail

The Sebago to the Sea Trail vision is to establish a continuous trail from Sebago Lake to Casco Bay, connecting Standish, Windham, Gorham, Westbrook, Portland and Falmouth. Members of the Sebago to the Sea Coalition are working with partners within each town to acquire rights of way. Connecting six towns, this trail will provide residents and visitors with wonderful biking, hiking, walking and commuting opportunities.
